Guide to Transcript Interpretation

This document is official if it bears the seal of the University and the Registrar's signature stamped in colored ink.

The University of Dallas is an equal-opportunity, co-educational Catholic institution of higher learning and is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

UNIT OF CREDIT: Credit is recorded in semester hours. Each semester hour represents the equivalent of one fifty-minute period per week for a sixteen-week semester (fifteen weeks of classes and one week of exams). An undergraduate student enrolled in at least 12 credit hours is considered full-time; a full-time graduate student must be enrolled in at least 9 credit hours.

GRADE KEY: A (superior), B (above average), C (average), D (passing but not counted toward advanced major field requirement or graduate degree), F (failure), FA (failure because of excessive absences), I (incomplete), I/PR (permanent incomplete), AD (audit), W (official withdrawal), WP (withdrawal passing), WF (withdrawal failing), MW (medical withdrawal), WA (withdrawal from an audit), UW (unofficial withdrawal), P (pass in a pass/no-pass course), NP (no credit in a pass/no-pass course), T (to be assigned at later date). Quality points for each semester hour: A (4), A- (3.7), B+ (3.3), B (3.0), B- (2.7), C+ (2.3), C (2.0), C- (1.7), D+ (1.3), D (1.0), D- (0.7), F (0). R/ - semester in Rome. Plus (+) and minus (-) grading was approved for use beginning with courses taken in Fall 1977 except for the Graduate College of Business, which adopted plus and minus grades beginning with courses taken in Fall 2002. A grade of C- or lower is considered failing in graduate school.

UNIVERSITY COURSE NUMBERING SYSTEM: From 1956 to Spring 1966, the course numbering system was three digits in length. From Fall 1966 to Fall 1972, a two-digit numbering system was used. At the request of the Texas State Coordinating Board Numbering System Committee, in the Spring of 1973, a change was made to the current four-digit system. Ex. ENG 1301 Literary Tradition I:

The first number of the course signifies the Course Level:

1000 and 2000 are freshman-sophomore level courses

3000 and 4000 are advanced (junior-senior level) courses

5000 are senior-graduate level courses

6000, 7000, 8000, 9000 are graduate level courses

The second digit of the course signifies the number of credit hours. A letter indicates the following:

"V": Variable credit - the number of credits are approved at the beginning of the term.

"F": A foundational level course. Credits are assigned based on the contact hours of the course: a minimum of 21 contact hours are required for 1.5 credits; 42 contact hours are required for a 3.0 credits.

"H": A Half-Term course, usually

The final two numbers of the course are assigned by the Department.

DEGREE REQUIREMENTS: Undergraduate students must complete a minimum of 120 approved semester hours at C or better (2.0), satisfy the University of Dallas core curriculum requirements, general degree requirements, 38 hours of advanced credits and satisfy all requirements for the major. Graduate students must complete their respective degree programs at B or better (3.0) except as noted in the University Bulletin.

HONORS: The baccalaureate degree with distinction, awarded to students who have maintained a high degree of scholastic excellence, is of three grades: Cum Laude, which requires a grade-point average of 3.400; Magna Cum Laude, a grade-point average of 3.700; and Summa Cum Laude, a grade-point average of 3.900. A transfer student, to be eligible for honors at graduation, must have earned sixty credits at the University of Dallas. The GPA used to qualify for honors, is computed on the basis of all college credit earned (Dual or Transfer Credit).
