He is responsible for providing support to 5 major commands, 11 System Program Offices, and multiple Department of Defense services and federal agencies.

Mr. James McArthur is the Director of Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) Distribution. Jim is responsible for the supply distribution facility providing wholesale and retail logistical support to a variety of customers within the Department of Defense and the Ogden Air Logistics Center with an inventory worth an excess of 10 billion dollars. Prior to this position, Jim was the Lockheed Martin Field Team Operations Program Manager for the Industrial Product Vendor contract. He was responsible for managing all staffing support of three United States Air Force Logistics Center contracts worth 750 million dollars for end-to-end supply chain management of more than 89,000 unique parts filling nearly a quarter million bins.

In 1996, Jim was commissioned from the University of Utah Reserve Officers' Training Corps program as a Second Lieutenant in the United States Air Force. He served in five different major commands and in several senior leadership roles. He supported 13 different mission design series aircraft as an aircraft maintenance officer, acquisition specialist, program manager and staff officer. He deployed in support of Operations Northern Watch and Iraqi Freedom. Furthermore, he retired from the United States Air Force in 2016 with 20 years of service.

Jim's military training includes the Aircraft Maintenance Officer Course, Squadron Officer School, Air Command and Staff College, Command General and Staff College of the United States Army, and finally Air War College.

Mr. Troy D Lee Kearney and Company

Troy D Lee is a contractor for Kearney and Company. He has 29 years of experience as an Air Force Financial Manager. He served as an enlisted Airman for 26 years in just about every capacity in the Financial Management career field to include Financial Services, Disbursing, Financial Management, and as a Group Resource Advisor. He also served at the Major Command level as a Policy and Program manager with a tour at United States Air

Forces Europe and Air Forces Africa. He deployed on 4 occasions to Africa, Afghanistan, Kuwait and lastly in Qatar where he served with the United States Army. His enlistment culminated in the leadership position of Squadron Superintendent. He retired from active duty in 2018 and his last duty location was Incirlik Air Base, Turkey. He has been on the DEAMS Deployment and Training Team since 2019 where he has helped deploy DEAMS to over 20 locations and trained over 200 Air Force Financial Managers.

Josh serves on the Board of Directors for Continue Mission, co-founded the organization, and volunteers his time to serve the CM family.

Josh is a two-tour Iraq war Veteran. While deployed he served as an IED Hunter. His unit (call sign Pathfinder 1) cleared routes of improvised explosive devices in and around Fallujah, Iraq for the Marines. Josh was Wounded in Action (WIA) March 15, 2007 and medevac'd out of Iraq to recover from injuries. Josh's battalion lost six great men in combat (three from his company) and lost four to suicide once home. Josh has experienced the pain of war and is still working to overcome the challenges presented to him as a result of his service to the country. He can relate

Josh was a successful business owner before being injured serving the country. His goals today are to help Veterans find the road to recovery so that they can start to enjoy life again.
